Meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm at the LWA Meeting Room. Present: President Paul Ellison, Vice President Deron McEldowney, Secretary Judy Thaxton, Asst. Treasurer Dave Fourman, Rod Suman, Matt Brueggemann, Tim Simmons and Amy Gilbert. Also present were Manager Kevin Thorpe, Office Manager Tammy Moore, Board Recorder Daphne Brunett, Officer Kevin Caplinger and 18 visitors. Ab-

sent: Treasurer Randy Blaich.

11-05-70 Deron McEldowney made the motion to approve the April 25, 2011 Board minutes. Amy Gilbert seconded. Motion approved.

LWA Report: Roger Riga noted the lawsuit by Camden regarding the leachate project was dismissed by the court. It is not known if any further action will be taken.

Manager's Report: Kevin Thorpe reported the tornado siren is now working. One battery was bad and has been replaced. The ODNR came and inspected the main dam, Thor dam and Valhalla Dam. The inspection appears to have gone well. Gasper Township removed the tree at the East gate. It is

now easier to get out onto Paint Creek Road.

Road work has begun, starting on Oslo Cove. Rain has been an issue. Mr. Paul Reed has donated a rescue boat for the beach.

The Marina building has received a conditional release for use. Once asphalt is down, a final inspection will be done.

Foreclosure papers were filed on a lot on Brande Drive. \$4,362.47 plus attorney fees are currently tied up in this lot. This is the first time the LPOA has foreclosed on a lot, so we will see how this process works, how long it takes and how expensive it is.

The annual audit will be done on May 23, 24, 25 and 26. Normally this is a 3-day event but an additional day was added, probably for the LWM audit.

Sheriff's Report: Deputy Caplinger noted he has done a comparison of statistics from this year to last year based on actual sheriff's reports. Reward signs have been

posted at the recreation areas.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Policy Review Committee—Deron McEldowney noted the committee is still working on the PDF files for the website.

Viking Editorial Committee—May 20th is the deadline for the June issue.

Building Committee—Jerry Spaeth noted 2 new committee members are needed.

Safety Committee—The next meeting is May 19th at 5:00 pm at the Lodge. Radios have been purchased and an example of the new Security shirts was shown.

11-05-71 Deron McEldowney made the motion to approve the purchase of deep blue Security shirts. Rod Suman seconded. Motion approved.

Marine/Lakes Committee—The fishing tournaments were discussed as well as the Lake Clarity Subcommittee. \$100 was donated to the Kids' Fishing Tournament.

Activities & Entertainment Committee—Tim Simmons noted the car show is June 5th. The agreement with the Red Cross for June 25th was signed. During the summer, teens will be reading to small children at the Lodge library. There are plans considered for a Volleyball Tournament and the committee is considering fundraisers including T-shirt/sweatshirt sales and bingo.

man made the motion to approve the research to accomplish activities for the Activities and Entertainment Committee, subject to final approval later on. Matt Brueggemann seconded. Motion approved.

RECOGNITION AND HEARING OF VISITORS

Susan Reese, lot 2272, presented a petition signed by residents of Longman Road and requested that Longman Road be removed from the LPOA, including all LPOA rights and the payment of dues and assessments. She cited various reasons for the request, including that no one seems concerned about the residents—lack of security, lack of

Absent: Amy Gilbert. The meeting began with an Executive Session at 6:04 pm to discuss the restaurant at the Lodge.

Matt Brueggemann who has been running the restaurant, explained there is not enough participation from the community, thus not enough income to keep the restaurant open for full service. A request for reduced hours was discussed, as well as changes to management and service. It was decided that May 28, 2011 would be the last day for the restaurant to be open. Mr. Brueggemann stated he wants to retire from running the business.

LWA VIKING REPORT FOR JULY 2011

Manhole/Valve Box Risers
The Lakengren Wa-

ter Authority is currently participating in the LPOA's road improvement project. As of mid-June, nine sewer manhole risers and six water valve box risers have been installed by LWA staff. LWA costs to date total \$1342. For the entire project it is estimated that approximately eighteen manholes and as many as twenty-five or more valve boxes will need to be adjusted. The total number involved will depend upon how far the road shoulder is extended.

Reduced Rate for Swimming Pool Set

At its May 20 meeting the Lakengren Water Authority BOT took action to bill the LPOA only the minimum charge for water usage at the pool for the 2011 summer season. This continues the longstanding tradition of providing this service to the community at a reduced cost. For the 2010 summer season this cost reduction amounted to \$2186.

OLCA Meeting

 Lakengren was well represented at the OLCA meeting held at Cinnamon Lake in May. LPOA Board President Paul Ellison, Treasurer Randy Blaich, Lake Manager Kevin Thorpe, and

OLCA Board member Paul Healy attended the meeting.

Cinnamon Lake has 520 homes with a total of 1600 building lots. They have their own sewer system and are in the process of replacing their whole water system. They have a 130 acre man-made lake, which they started 45 years ago. They have a sand beach, basketball and tennis court, a sand volleyball court, a heated outside pool, a softball field, and three picnic areas with shelters. They have a large community room with several alcoves. Prior to our meeting, they had a fix up, paint up, cleanup program because "company is coming." It was related that high school students in the area have to donate 10 hours to a community service prior to their graduation. These students came forth and the Cinnamon Lake residents appreciated their assistance. Previously their lake waters were a source of their water supply. To prevent contamination, they only allowed boats with a maximum of 5 HP electric motors. It is a good fishing lake and the horsepower will increase after their new water system is installed.

You may wish to check out the OLCA

website for a list of all the other lakes to get some comparisons. It will make you proud of our Lakengren community and what we have accomplished by our various LPOA boards, maintenance department, community clubs/committees, and Lakengren advocates and volunteers.

It was announced at the May meeting that Lakengren will be the host lake community in the fall of 2012. The last time we hosted an OLCA meeting was in 2005.

LAKENGREN BOATERS & FISHERMEN

The Lakengren Lake & Marine Committee would like to offer some suggestions on how to keep from spreading invasive species from one body of water to another and our Lakes in Lakengren.

Remove any visible mud, plants, fish or animals before transporting boats.

Eliminate water from equipment before transporting (empty live wells, drain bilges, minnow buckets).

Clean and dry anything that came in contact with water (boats, trailers, equipment, clothing, dogs, etc.).

Never release plants, fish or animals into a body of water unless they came out of that body of water.

Yes, even the minnow bucket should be emptied and rinsed out with tap water.

If you put Lake Erie water in your minnow bucket and then decide to stop at an inland lake on your way home, the first minnow you use could be carrying tiny organisms. And if you eventually decide to dump out the bucket of water and minnows into that inland lake, you probably are starting the invasion of zebra mussels, quagga mussels or some other invasive species.

Where Have ALL the Mallards Gone?

Most folks recognize the male Mallard duck with its green head and bright yellow bill and have seen the mottled brown female with her orange and black bill and iridescent violet-blue wing patch accompanying him, even if they might not know her without him. Mallards are the number one most abundant duck in the United States, in North America, and in the entire Northern Hemisphere. (Frank C. Bellrose. Ducks, Geese and Swans of North America) They may even be the most abundant duck on earth as they thrive any place there is water, vegetation for food and cover, from the Arctic tundra to the subtropics, in fresh and salt water and even brackish wetlands. We have a plentiful resident population here in Lakengren too. In the December 2010 Bird Count, when all the small lakes and most of the main lake were frozen, I counted 136 Mallards mingling with the Canada Geese in the last patch of open water from Eagle Cove to the dam. They are much easier to count when forced to congregate in one spot!

With 136 individuals, that might be as many as 68 couples, though probably not. Mallards do pair up in the fall and their courtship displays last much of the winter. Usually, though, some singles don't find a mate. For those that do, nest site selection occurs in rainy April when one can often see a pair swimming in a soggy roadside ditch. As they wander looking for the perfect spot, the bonded couple may end up quite a distance from the water. One hundred feet is common; a mile is quite rare.

Chasing off any other Mallard that comes by, male drakes are notoriously territorially aggressive as their mates build the nest. Usually the nest is hidden on the ground in some tall thick grasses, a stand of reeds or under a shrubby bush, but I have seen nests in those too-wet-to-mow tall grasses of roadside ditch-

es, in the rooftop garden of Carrabba's Italian Grill and in a flowerbox on a condominium balcony overlooking a pond. One time, a female Mallard even built her nest in the enclosed courtyard garden at Driscoll Elementary School in Centerville OH much to the excitement of the students and the worry of the adults!

In May, as the females begin laying one egg per day (Frank C. Bellrose) the pair bond between drake and hen weakens. By the time she settles down for the 28 days it takes to incubate the 7-10 eggs, he has abandoned her. Hidden out of sight, protected from predators, it is no won-

der we rarely see a female Mallard in May, but where have all the males gone?

When the ducklings hatch into those cute yellow and brown spotted chicks with dark eye stripes, it is only a matter of hours until their feathers dry and Mom leads them away from the nest never to return. It is not uncommon to see a single file line of ducklings following mother duck, stopping traffic as they cross streets, traveling from nest to water with no male Mallard to help. For the next two months (all of June and July), the ducklings live and grow under the protective watch of only their mother. No green-headed duck has been seen in Lakengren since May, nor likely will be again until late September.

Why have all the drakes disappeared? Where have they gone? Opposite of songbirds like the American Goldfinch that molt to duller colors in winter, male Mallards begin molting in June right after mating season. Green heads, rusty chest, pale sides and black and white tails are gradually replaced by the same mottled brown feathers the female wears. Once fully camouflaged in this "eclipse" plumage, drakes lose all their flight feathers at once. For the 3-4 weeks it takes to grow new ones, the males cannot fly and are extremely vulnerable to predators hence the need for duller colors.

Where have all the male Mallards gone? They congregate with other males whiling away the summer in the se-



clusion of shallow reedy marshes. They are still here in Lakengren disguised as females. What does not change and ultimately gives them away as molting males is the bright yellow bill. By late July, new flight feathers are in place. Camouflage is no longer necessary so the drakes once again molt. Discarding the female garb, they re-grow their distinctive emerald green head, white neck-

lace, chestnut breast, pale grey side and black and white tail feathers. Hens will molt in August after the young have flown, but since they just replace old feathers with new ones, it takes only half the time.

As you look out on the lakes of Lakengren this July, peer into the shadows of the cattails. Should a stray ray of sunshine light up a bright yellow bill on a drab brown duck, know that you have spotted the elusive summer male Mallard!

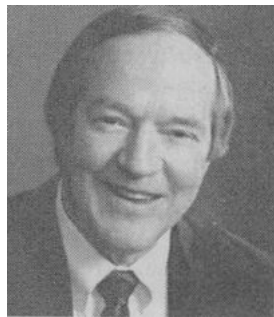



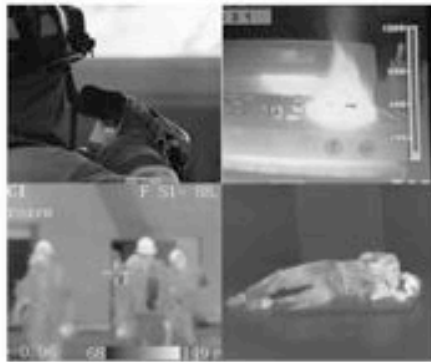
